

## Pastoral Letter for January 2023

Janus – the Roman god from which the first month of our calendar gets its name – is most often depicted with two faces, looking in opposite directions. Known as the god of beginnings, gates, transitions, time, duality, doorways, passages, frames, and endings: An appropriate choice by the Romans to mark the turn of the year.

Now, while I do like the promise of new beginnings, I am increasingly coming to find the passing of time quite daunting. 2023 is here - I am sure it was 1987 last time I looked - and, this year, I turn 50. A milestone birthday they say. So old! (According to the younger generation...) Still young! (According to those who are older than me...)

I find myself looking forward with trepidation – wondering if I can manage to do any of the things this coming year that I have written on my ever-hopeful to-do list for life. I also find myself looking back more than is good for me... on the things I wish I had not left undone. The things I wish I had not done at all. The things I wish I could do again...but differently this time, with hindsight and experience.

The one thing I don't do often enough, however, is just stand still and enjoy the view from this part of my journey. Seeing how far I have come in my 50 years of life, noticing where I stand today, acknowledging what has made me 'me', setting my feet in the direction of whatever is next.

Stop. Look. Take in the view. Count our blessings. Acknowledge our troubles. And see them all in the context of the whole. In one single moment, we are each all we have been, and we are each all we have yet to be.

As humans we seem to be ever mindful of the past and ever wondering about the future. But the Bible reminds us that it is good sometimes to simply stop and take it all in.
