## **Pastoral Letter from the Rector**

On Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> November this year, it is World Kindness Day. What is kindness?

Maybe it's about words: Thinking about what we want to say and the way we are going to say it. Are my words going to build someone up, encourage the best in them and for them? Do they communicate in a way that reflects the innate value of the person to whom I am speaking — or did they come with an 'edge' that made that person wince uncomfortably, feeling criticised or shamed in some way? Was I impatient or irritable? Manipulative or spiteful? Could I have said it better? Could I have been kinder?

Maybe it's about attitude: choosing to see the best in a person or situation. Do I carry suspicion and negative expectations into my interactions with others or do I approach them with grace — assuming well-meaning before malice? If I am upset by something someone says, or does, am I able to hold that position of grace; make allowances for the irritations that might affect someone else's day and not just consider my own?

Maybe it's an action: physically doing for others what we can; noticing their needs; keeping our eyes open for the opportunities we have to help someone; to do something that makes someone else's day lighter and helps them feel that they are seen and cared about.

#### I think it's all three.

Kindness in our words, attitudes, and actions, can change the course of someone's day. Maybe even their life I suppose. And it changes our day too. Being kind on purpose feels good! We are made for it: The Bible speaks time and time again of God's loving-kindness and also tells us humanity was created in God's image. Kindness is part of our spiritual DNA. You wouldn't know it, looking around the world right now. As we read and watch the news unfold on a daily basis – the pain and devastation of war. The political division; the fear of the future; the rising violence among our young people...

It can feel pretty hopeless. But let's not let it stop us from trying; from sowing the seeds of kindness in our communities.

One of my favourite Bible passages is Ephesians, chapter 4. It ends with the exhortation to 'be kind and compassionate to one another...'

Couldn't we all do with a bit more of that? And maybe we could manage it for more than just one day!

## St Nicholas Church Tower Clock

Our ancient and well-loved turret clock on the tower of St Nicholas Church does not keep good time, but then it is 300 years old! With receipt of a generous gift we have arranged for Gillett & Johnson to supply a quartz master clock with radio receiver, electromagnetic bell hammer to strike the hours and quarter chimes on the existing bell, during the day only. The master clock has a battery back up so a mains failure will not affect it. Summer and Winter time changes are carried out automatically. As the master is monitored by radio signal from the Atomic clock, time keeping is extremely accurate.
