Snowdrop Spreading at St Mary's Saturday 5th April

Over the last few years, 'Snowdrop Sunday' has become a very popular community event.

For this year, and for one year only, we plan to alter the arrangements to allow for 'Snowdrop Spreading'.

We will be dividing and spreading the snowdrops, so that the abundance of white flowers creep further into different parts of the churchyard from 2026 onwards.

The splitting process must be carried out when the snowdrops are, 'in the green'. This means that the flowers will have finished, although the green leaves will still be evident. We will split the bulbs into smaller clumps to make even more dreamy white drifts of flowers. So, pop the date into your diary and come along with



gardening gloves and a trowel. Join the big dig by taking part or just watching! Refreshments will help to make it a social event! Come along anytime from 9.30am when the churchyard working party will be on hand to give you guidance.

Many of you may still want to see the snowdrops in February this year. The churchyard is always open so do come and see the spectacle of tiny white flowers that hint at the promise of the spring to come. Everyone is welcome. However, you may like to visit during the morning of **Saturday 8th February**, when the bells will be rung. Our Church Warden, Iain Simmons, will be on hand for a chat and we will endeavour to keep you warm with hot drinks!

Maintaining Your Roadside Ditches

The recent cold snap led to a lot of ice forming on highways. Some of this was prolonged by water overflowing from ditches or blocked culverts onto the highway. KCC are responsible for keeping culverts operating satisfactorily and we are continually asking for them to be cleansed and blockages jetted out. However, the open ditches alongside our highways are not usually KCC's responsibility, but the riparian duty of the adjacent landowner (even if you think your landholding ends at the hedge!). It is often the hedge cutting debris that is partially blocking the ditches which can lead to hidden culvert blockages.

Please ensure that you have your ditches cleared after hedge cutting operations and remove any debris that has accumulated in them regularly. Ultimately overhanging hedges, trees and the like can come to the notice of the KCC who can send landowners a letter to get any blockages cleared and charge land owners their costs if it is not done. An article in the July 2023 Herald covered this in greater detail but seems to have had little effect.
