GARDENING NOTES BY TINA WOODHAM

August is known as the Harvest Month and is said to be named in honour of the Roman Emperor, Augustus. The 1st August is recognised as Lammastide, the festival of the beginning of harvest when the first sheaf of corn was offered and blessed in the church and loaves baked from the flour of the first grains.

This year marks the 50th anniversary of the great drought of 1976 where temperatures regularly hit the mid-30s and much of the country suffered a lack of rain for 45 days. Sounding familiar?



Heat and humidity creates a favourable environment for insect pests. Aphids are active this time of year and ladybirds will happily feed on a wide variety of small insects and insect eggs. Encourage them into the garden by companion planting with marigolds and nasturtiums.



It goes without saying that continued watering is an essential task this month along with regular deadheading to keep pots and perennials in tip top condition. Don't forget to treat them to a weekly liquid feed! Water slowly, directly into the soil to get to the root system and not onto the leaves. Fill the pot to the rim and let it soak into the soil before repeating. If the surface of the soil is dry, the water will overflow over the top of the pot and be wasted. It's important to keep the soil healthy – so don't oversaturate it as this will flush out essential nutrients. Grouping pots together will increase the air humidity in that area.

In the borders some of the early summer flowering plants may be looking past their best, so boost colour in the garden by planting up containers with new fuchsia, dahlia or tall late perennials which can then be strategically placed into any empty gaps. Once finished, the pots can be emptied and dug directly into the border for colour next year.

Prune wisteria, cutting back the whippy green shoots of the current year's growth to 5 or 6 leaves.

August is a busy time for harvesting edibles. Regular cropping of vegetables, especially courgettes, beans, peas and salads will encourage further produce.

Remove the bottom leaves from your tomato plants to ensure good air circulation and allowing the sun to ripen the fruits. The hotter weather makes tomatoes prone to blossom-end rot which is caused by an erratic supply of moisture, so ensure you water and feed on a regular basis.



After harvesting summer fruiting raspberries, the spent canes may be cut to soil level leaving the new canes to develop for next year.

Our gardens would not be complete nor function without wildlife. Keeping patches of longer grass in areas of your lawn will provide insect habitats and some shelter from the sun. August is a key month for butterflies and plants such as buddleja, dahlia and geranium offer a valuable source of nectar.

PASTORAL LETTER FROM LAURA FAULKNER

I've just been sitting in one of the churches having a cup of tea and chatting to a few different folk. It was a real oasis in my day which has been packed full of emails and phone calls and organising.

I returned home to write this letter to you all and found myself revitalised and a little more energetic to complete the rest of the tasks on my list for the day.



In another existence, I was a schoolteacher, and, as August approaches, I find myself naturally wanting to slow down and rest. It's been 6 years since I last had school summer holidays, but I find my mind and body are still locked into that gentle rhythm I lived within for many years as a child, student, parent, and a teacher...U

In the Old Testament, one of the first things in creation to be established were patterns: light and dark, night and day... and what came with that was a rhythm of rest. God rested from his labours and commanded humanity to make time to do the same. In both the Jewish, Christian, and Islamic faiths, observing a regular day of rest, is a rhythm of life taught and encouraged.

In other world religions, while there may be no formal day of the week given over to rest, reflection and stepping out of the busyness of everyday life is considered vital to human flourishing.

FLYING AROUND THE FARLEIGHS



Sheila's Swifts

Like many parish churches, East Farleigh's has benefited over the years from the dedicated support of volunteers. Sheila Allchin has been one of them for more years than she cares to remember, happy to turn her hand to any task asked of her. Unbeknown to most, though, she also plays a significant part in conserving our local swift population centred, as it is in many villages, in the lofty nooks and crannies of our ancient church.



Viewed by Christians and non-Christians alike - and those of no faith at all - swifts have a spiritual value in confirming that the cycle of nature continues, no small thing in a world dangerously close to climate breakdown. As poet Ted Hughes described their return:

*'Look! They're back! Look!'
They've made it again,
Which means the globe's still working, the
Creation's
Still waking refreshed.*

And Sheila's contribution? Her regular presence in the building lets her alert me to the seemingly inevitable problem of a swift, nesting in the chancel roof, becoming trapped inside the church. Once inside, the birds are doomed to starve – COVID

was a disaster for birds trapped in locked-down churches as many perished.

A few weeks ago, Sheila's annual call came after Sunday morning's service – all the more urgent as a Christening was due to take place at two that afternoon.

It's actually a simple task to rescue trapped swifts (providing you are suitably licenced by Natural England) and within the hour the unfortunate bird had been trapped, carefully examined and set free again. It turned out to be a female bird that was still incubating young, so another two lives were at stake. It also meant she was at least two years old and had probably been hatched in the same nest cavity, or nearby – there are four artificial swift nest boxes on the building's north wall.

Since fledging, therefore, she will have been permanently airborne for a remarkable two years at least, feeding, drinking and sleeping on the wing over central Africa and the southern hemisphere before returning to The Farleighs, even mating on the wing too, and eventually touching down to lay her two eggs in the Church.

As with previously trapped birds, a ring with a unique number to identify her should she ever be re-encountered was attached to her leg and she was released unharmed, immediately rejoining the small screaming group circling above the churchyard. For me, the privilege of holding such a delicate scrap of life in my hand is always spiritually uplifting. Given the Christening due to take place an hour or so later, it was easy to compare the spirituality of providing the swift with a renewed chance of life with that of the belief that baptism is also the start of a Christian life for a child.



Let's hope the infant's life takes-off as joyfully as Sheila's swift did! Thank you, Sheila.
