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GARDENING NOTES BY TINA WOODHAMS

The hot temperatures experienced during August has meant that our garden plants and produce have peaked earlier this year, and the wheat harvest is reported to be running around three weeks ahead of normal timescales. Water security is becoming increasingly a topic for discussion.



The turning of the season into September brings fewer daylight hours and although still warm, cooler temperatures and mistier mornings. This weather may be more agreeable to us so make the most of your garden! There's still much to be harvested and stored for the winter months, and plans to be started for the year ahead.



It's time to lift your maincrop potatoes and dry before storing – use hessian or paper sacks and keep in a cool, dark place away from nibbling rodents! Ensure that your potatoes are all undamaged as you store them, it can take only one rotten tuber to spread disease throughout the entire crop.

Fruits of squash and pumpkin ready for harvest next month should be raised off the surface of the soil to keep them away from dampness and avoid slug damage. Removing leaves from the plants will allow the sun to ripen the skins and increase air circulation between the fruits.

Courgettes are prone to die off at this time however keep them cropping longer by watering beneath the leaves to lessen the risk of powdery mildew.

Use up any remaining seeds of mixed lettuce and spinach by sowing in a protected area or in containers to give you a further harvest before winter, remembering to protect from slugs and snails which will emerge once the soil becomes damp again.

You may be lucky enough to still have annual bedding plants, if so keep on dead heading and feeding once a week to encourage them to provide a display into the autumn. Biennials such as wallflowers and dianthus are available (sometimes in bare root form) and if planted now will give you a reliable source of colour in the spring.



Mulching your borders is a really good method of conserving water in the soil. In preparation for the autumn leaf fall, get ahead of the game and create a leaf mould bin which will in the future provide you with a low-cost way to improve your garden soil.

Spring flowering bulbs will now be available for purchase and depending on variety can be planted from September onwards. So treat yourselves and look forward to creating a splash of colour for next year!

We may have experienced dry, brown lawns during the past few weeks but there's the wonderful colours of autumn to look forward to.....

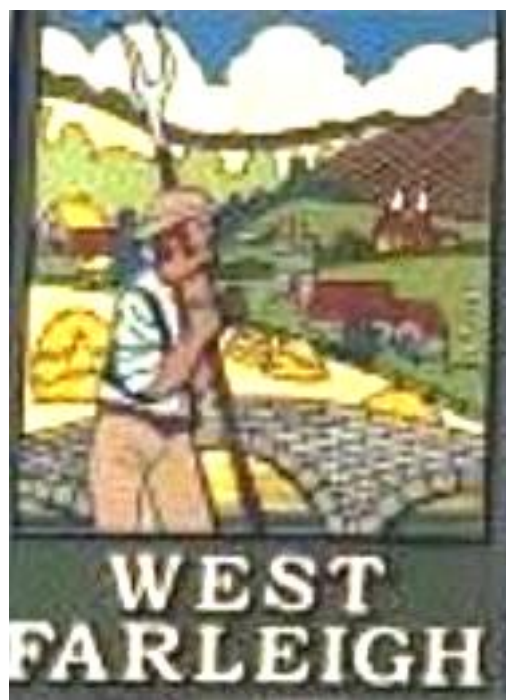
The funding for the Tommy Statues engraving

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FLYING AROUND THE FARLEIGHS



It's That Time of Year Again.

"Where are they? My garden's normally full of birds, but now there are hardly any!" So goes the most asked question of birdwatchers at this time of year. And with good reason. At the very time when the country's bird population is probably at its greatest with all this year's youngsters swelling the total, not only have the birds gone quiet, but they've also deserted our garden feeders too.



There's a perfectly simple explanation. To begin with, Nature is providing a veritable smorgasbord of food: insects, seeds, berries and fruits of all kinds fill the hedgerows so suddenly the sunflower hearts and fat balls may seem less appealing to our regular garden visitors, and the smaller, or less dominant, birds don't have to queue for their turn when there is so much available in the nearby bushes. And a nearby bush, especially if it's a thorny bramble, sloe or hawthorn, is a good place to be for many birds as most are now moulting. Not only does the cover afford food within easy reach, but it also means safety from predators at a time when birds' flying is impaired because they don't have a full set of flight feathers. They can still fly, but not so well as each wing could have three or four feathers either missing or not fully grown. Their body feathers are all being systematically replaced too, and this all adds to the energy requirement for new feather growth, so sitting quietly frees up the calories for it.

It has to be said that they don't look their best either - a bit tatty, if we're honest. Young starlings still have a mixture of brown juvenile feathers sticking out of their iridescent adult plumage; normally smart robins can look as though they've been in a stand-off with another robin that ended in fisticuffs; and a bald-headed blackbird that may have finally finished raising its second or even third brood appearing to gone ten rounds with 'our 'Enery' (remember him?).



A moulting In a matter of weeks though, their smart new plumage will be ready for the rigours of migration for those that do it, or for surviving an English winter (whatever that may turn out to be like) for those that don't. The robin, furthermore, unique among our garden visitors, will then be singing its mournful autumn song in preparation for establishing its winter territory. Autumn will be well underway.
